**Check Eligibility**

**Q.** What if there is a tie for merit?

**ANS:** If there is a tie, the tie breaking system for 16-17 was as per **DTE Information brochure 2017-18**

The merit list for the Candidates who are Maharashtra state candidate, All India Candidate, Minority Candidate and J & K Migrant, shall be prepared on the basis of marks or score secured by the Candidate in the CET conducted by the Competent Authority or marks or score secured in any other examination conducted by the concerned appropriate authority for the purpose of admission to these Courses. Provided that, in case of tie, the relative merit of Candidates shall be resolved in the following order of preference and the methodology as specified below:

- Higher marks in Mathematics at CET;
- Higher marks in Physics at CET;
- Higher percentage of marks in Board or qualifying examination for Physics, Mathematics and Chemistry taken together;
- Higher percentage of marks in the subject Mathematics at HSC;
- Higher percentage of marks in the subject Physics at HSC;
- Higher percentage of marks in Aggregate at HSC.

**Q.** I am open category student with PCM less than 50%. Can I opt for engineering with some other subject?

**ANS:** Instead of Chemistry there are other subjects,

- Phy and Maths (Compulsory) and (Chemistry or Biotechnology or Biology or Technical or Vocational subjects ) + CET 2018  
OR  
Diploma (50% for Open Category and 45% for reserved Category)  
OR  
B.Sc. (50% for Open Category and 45% for reserved Category + XII th Maths Compulsory)  
(After CAP round if seats are vacant)

Also – if you want - You can check your eligibility on DTE website by entering your marks.

**Q.** I am from OBC category but I do not have the related documents. Can I apply for EBC?

**ANS:** If your admission is through open category by DTE (that means if you have not occupied OBC seat from Govt quota) – you can apply for EBC scholarship provided you have the required Income certificate and all other documents like Domicile, Adhaar card, Bank account on your name etc .

**Q. What is the income limit for OBC, NT, VJNT etc?**

**Ans:** The income limit was revised on 01/01/2018 and increased to upto 8 Lakhs with effect from 2017-18 year admissions.

**Q. I don't have category documents. Allotment of open seat. Hence full fee payment. Do I have to pay this fee for all 4 yrs? How can I keep my category info for future benefits?**

**Ans:** Category once treated open, is applicable for all 4 years. Your basic caste/category if mentioned on the school leaving certificate, college will also mention it on TC for future benefits.

**Q. I belong to reserved category. I was allotted a seat in open All India quota. Whether I'll have fee benefit is my query.**

**Ans:** As long as you have your category related documents (1. Caste Certificate, 2. Caste Validity & 3. Non Creamy Layer Certificate ) with domicile of Maharashtra state, for monetary benefits, you will have to pay only the fee applicable to that category.

**Q. I am a non-Maharashtrian reserved category candidate who has appeared for CET. Shall I get fee benefits applicable for my caste?**

**Ans:** The fee benefits are only for Maharashtra candidates. You will be treated as open category candidate + OMS (Other than Maharashtra state). Hence you will have to pay full fee. However, you are entitled for category benefits in your home state.

**Q. When education loan is sanctioned by the Bank, I will get it or the Bank sends it to the college?**

**Ans:** You have to take admission first by paying necessary fees and apply for a Fee Structure & Bonafide certificate from college. The college will then give the certificate within a week. The bank sanctions loan after Bonafide certificate is submitted by the candidate while applying loan and sends it to college or students account as per bank's policy.

**Q. What is TFWS (Tuition fee waiver scheme)? Can we opt for it?**

**ANS:** This scheme has been implemented by Govt of Maharashtra. This year 2018-19 information Brochure from DTE is yet to be declared, but as per last year information brochure the Income Limit from all sources is below 6 lakhs, (This year also it is likely to remain the same)

**Q. What is the difference between BE & B.Tech.?**

**Answer:** Practically nothing. BE is bachelor of engineering & B.Tech. is bachelor of technology. In Maharashtra most of the universities have named the engineering course as B.E. while IIT's & few Autonomous institutes like COE, Pune named it B.Tech.

**Question: Is it necessary to give CET for taking admission in First Year at engineering colleges in Maharashtra?**

**Answer:** Yes. It is necessary to give CET for taking admission in first year at all engineering colleges approved by All India Council for Technical Education i.e. AICTE for the academic year 2018-19.

**Question: Can a student from Nagpur (or outside Pune University area) take admission to college in Pune?**

**Answer:** Yes.

Colleges affiliated to Pune University- Student has to apply under 30% quota of CAP seats earmarked for students from other universities.

For admission to autonomous colleges (Like COE, Pune or VIT, Pune) - students from other universities can compete for 100% seats.

**Question: What is important, Branch or College?**

**Answer:** If you are clear about branch selection then college selection becomes secondary but if you are not sure about which branch to select or confused between 2 or 3 branches or ready to take up any branch then do give preference for good college. In connection to your above question, I would like to tell you that MMCOE has good infrastructure, excellent faculty members, various student chapters, well-equipped labs. In addition, MMCOE is centrally located. Hostel facility is available both for boys and girls in campus for outstation students etc.

**Question: Are there any seats reserved for female candidates?**

**Answer:** 30% seats are reserved in every branch of engineering except Mining Engineering out of the seats available for CAP.

**Question: How to claim seats under management quota?**

**Answer:** Well you surely can apply for one at any un-aided non-minority engineering college directly (no management quota is available in Government or Govt. aided Engg. Colleges). There are 20% seats available in this category.

**Question: Can one apply with CET score as well as JEE score at the same time?**

**Answer:** Yes. JEE students can apply for 15% quota while CET students can apply for 65% seats. If you have given MHT-CET as well as JEE you can apply for both the quota seats in single option form. You are allotted -the best of both the allotments- at the end of particular CAP round.

**Direct Second Year Admissions**

**Q. Diploma is from deemed University. Whether admission is possible for SE?**

**ANS:** Universities do not offer Diploma Courses. Diploma is awarded by Technical Board. So you can apply to DTE for admission to Direct 2<sup>nd</sup> year.

**Q. Those who complete diploma can take admission for second year. But if the chance of getting for SE is less, can he opt for FE? (No CET is given).**

**ANS:** See, you can apply for DSE but as far as admission to First Year Engg is concerned – as per the rules of Rules of DTE (2018-19) – Diploma Students can apply for admission to FE (Change if any will be communicated.)

## **CATEGORY NO 2**

(Admission enquiries for admission at MMCOE)

**Q. What is the rank of your college?**

**ANS:** MMCOE tops in result when the other colleges started with MMCOE are compared. Overall, We are in Top 5.

**Q. Is it possible to change the branch after FE (i.e. while going for SE)?**

**ANS:** Yes, Branch Change is possible. After the First Year Engineering Results are declared, the vacancies are declared, Applications are invited from interested students and as per the merit and available seats, branch changes are given to students.

**Q. What are the working hours for college?**

**ANS:** College works on all days – if required we call students on Sundays for extra lectures. We have a very BUSY schedule throughout the term. We prefer to work even on holidays in order to complete the



academic activities or to complete the syllabus. We conduct remedial coaching class also for weak students.

We have a well defined academic policy to run MMCOE academics. Please refer to this Academic Policy File to go through more details. Also we maintain the course files for each and every subject.

So to complete the big task of academics along with various curricular and extracurricular activities, time is not the limit for us.

But we are after the students all the time asking them to complete assignments, homework, practical, tutorial, theory so on and so forth.

Speaking official, it is 6 days a week. Morning 8 to 4 pm\*. / 10 to 5 pm \* (Minimum 7 hrs) and more depending on the need of extra lectures.

### **Direct Second Year Admissions**

**Q. How many seats are there for SE per branch?**

**ANS:** Direct Second Year admissions are made as Govt Quota of 12 students per the Sanctioned intake of 60 (i.e. 20% of Sanctioned Intake) Plus we can fill DSE seats depending upon the clear vacancies which are created after FE results are declared.

**Q. Are all these seats open or there is reservation of any kind?**

**ANS:** Yes, there is reservation according to Govt norms declared time to time

## **CATEGORY NO 3**

### **(Training placement related FAQ)**

**Q. What is the placement %?**

**ANS:** Against the eligible students (throughout 60%) around 80% (2015-16) students got the placement. There are few companies which recruit students without any criteria also and placements for 2016-17 are still going on.

**Q. Which are the companies that come here for campus recruitment?**

**Q. When does the training for placement start?**

**ANS:** We focus on T and P right from first year (Second Sem).

## **CATEGORY NO 4**

(Finance related FAQs - College Fees and Hostel Fees Loan facilities for students)

### **Q. Breakup of fees per year?**

**ANS:** Please refer to Fee details file. At present it is the interim fee. It may change by 5 to 9 % subject to approval from Shikshan Shulka Samiti (Now it is called Fee Regulatory Authority).

### **Q. Can I pay the fees partially now and remaining later?**

**ANS:** See, you will get admission now. Generally we do not grant permission for part payment. However, if there is genuine problem, please tell how much you can pay now, I will talk to the authorities – try to pay maximum amount at the time of admission and remaining you can give PDCs (Post Dated Cheques)

### **Q. What is the income limit for EBC scholarship? Who can avail it?**

**ANS:** Upto 8 lakh and is available to only open category students. This Facility is not for institute level admissions.

### **Q. Is it possible that if the fees are paid per year but my ward comes here for the exam due to some other commitments, is that allowed?**

**ANS:** Please note that this is a full time course. You are taking admission for a full time course where attendance norms are minimum 75% as per University norms and for MMCOE we follow norms of min 90% attendance for theory and 100 % for practical.

## **CATEGORY NO 5**

(Hostel Enquiries)

### **Q. How many students per each room in hostel?**

**ANS:** For Boys: Devgiri Boys Hostel B: 3, 5, 6 (Due to rooms with varying sizes)

For Girls: 4 students in one room

### **Q. What is the size of hostel room?**

**Ans:** There are various sizes of hostel rooms with around 204 sq ft area.

No part payment of fees is allowed.

**Q. What are the branches for diploma at MM Poly, Kalewadi?**

**ANS:** Total intake for all branches is 360 including 1<sup>st</sup> and 2<sup>nd</sup> shift (Computer, E & Tc, Mechanical, Automobile)

**Q. How far is Kalewadi (Polytechnic) from here?**

**ANS:** Around 15 km from Pune. Off Thergaon Link Road.

**Q. Candidates who 'have reported to Admission Reporting Center (ARC) and paid Seat Acceptance Charges, But not reported to the allotted Institute and not confirmed admission by paying balance fees' will get refund or not?**

**ANS:** During academic year 2016-17, Admission Regulating Authority has considered such requests sympathetically and had decided to refund the amount after deducting processing charges and other expenses incurred in refunding this amount.

However from the year 2017-18, the seat acceptance fee paid by the candidate shall be forfeited if the Candidate fails to report to the institute after reporting to the ARC.
