FAQs Regarding General Process of Admission (Counseling 2024-25)

CATEGORY NO. 1

(Admission Rules DTE)

Q. Which website to refer to for admission process information?

Ans: Government of Maharashtra has established a State Common Entrance Test Cell (CET CELL) under Admission Regulating Authority (ARA) for the conduction of Admission process.

Q. What if I register after the last date of registration?

Ans: You have to register for the engineering admission process using the link published on the above mentioned website. Document verification is carried out by the scrutiny center. After the declaration of merit list, you may be considered for non CAP seats, if it is before the admission cut-off date. Refer to the detailed schedule and guidelines published by the State CET Cell in this regard .

Q. When do I go to the ARC (as mentioned in the Information Brochure) after CAP round 1?

Ans: Last year there was no need to go to ARC as candidates could pay seat confirmation fees through online mode only.

Q. What after CAP round 1 allotment?

Ans:

- I. Candidates who have been allotted the seat as per their first preference in Round I (auto freezed) shall pay the seat acceptance fee by online mode through their login. Such candidates shall not be eligible for participation in subsequent Rounds.
- II. Candidates who have allotted other than first preference and self freezed their allotment in Round I through their login must accept the seat and shall pay the seat acceptance fee by online mode through their login. Such candidates shall not be eligible for participation in subsequent Rounds. (Candidate must exercise this option carefully).

- III. Candidates who have allotted other than first preference and want betterment in the subsequent rounds must claim the allotted seat in Round I by accepting that seat by choosing **NOT Freeze** option for betterment and shall pay the seat acceptance fee by online mode through their login.

Q. What after CAP Round 1?

Ans: After the CAP round 1 allotment and paying seat acceptance fees through online mode, remaining vacant seats shall be displayed.

Q. What are the things to be kept in mind while accepting & reporting after CAP round II?

Ans: All eligible candidates participated in Round II and allotted the seat first time shall self-verify the seat allotment. The candidate who have been allotted the seat first time in Round II shall pay seat acceptance fee through his/her login by online mode.

[Note: Candidates who have been allotted the seat/seat retained/got betterment in Round II and reported to ARC must report to the allotted Institute for confirmation of admission.]

Q. What is the intake of this college?

Q. Where do I fill the common admission form?

Ans: Refer to Website: <https://cetcell.mahacet.org/>. You will be directed to the Engineering Admission process webpage.

Q. When will CAP rounds start?

Ans: Refer to the notification published by the State CET Cell for Engineering Admissions. It is generally published after the conduction of MHT-CET examination.

Q. When College will start?

Ans: College will start on as per the date mentioned in the Admission notification published by the State CET Cell. You will know these details also at the time of admission.

Q. If the category student cannot produce a caste validity certificate at the time of admission, how much time he/she gets for submission?

Ans: If permitted by the State CET Cell, the SC, ST, VJ/DT- NT(A), NT(B), NT(C), NT(D), OBC, SBC and EWS Candidates who submit the receipt of Caste/Tribe Validity Certificate, Non Creamy Layer Certificate, EWS Certificate during the E- document verification and confirmation period should scan and submit Caste/ Tribe Validity Certificate, Non Creamy Layer Certificate, EWS Certificate later. Guidelines regarding the submission are published in the admission notice and further updates thereafter on the State CET Cell website from time to time. Non-submission of the above documents by these candidates can lead to cancellation of allotted seats.

Q. Is PCM in 12th compulsory for admission to First Year engineering? What are the eligibility criteria?

Ans: Yes, Minimum PCM percentage - 45% (minimum 134 marks out of 300) for open and 40% (minimum 119 marks out of 300) for reserved category. Eligibility can be checked using the State CET Cell website.

NOTIFICATION

For example, for Maharashtra state candidature

- (i) The Candidate should be an Indian National;
- (ii) Passed HSC or its equivalent examination with Physics and Mathematics as compulsory subjects along with one of the Chemistry or Biotechnology or Biology or Technical Vocational subject or Computer Science or Information Technology or Informatics Practices or Agriculture or Engineering Graphics or Business Studies and obtained at least 45 % marks (at least 40 % marks, in case of Backward Class categories, Economically Weaker Section and Persons with Disability category candidates belonging to Maharashtra State), in the above subjects taken together; and the Candidate should have appeared in all the subjects in CET and should obtain non zero score in CET conducted by the Competent Authority;

or

(ii) Passed Diploma in Engineering and Technology and obtained at least 45 % marks (at least 40 % marks, in case of Backward Class categories, Economically Weaker Section and Persons with Disability category candidates belonging to Maharashtra State);

Q. What if there is a tie for merit?

Ans: The merit list for the Candidates who are Maharashtra state candidate, All India Candidate, Minority Candidate and J & K Migrant, shall be prepared on the basis of marks or score secured by the Candidate in the CET conducted by the Competent Authority or marks or score secured in any other examination conducted by the concerned appropriate authority for the purpose of admission to these Courses. Provided that, in case of tie, the relative merit of Candidates shall be resolved in the following order of preference and the methodology as specified below:

- (a) Higher marks in Mathematics at CET;
- (b) Higher marks in Physics at CET;
- (c) Higher percentage of marks in Board or qualifying examination for Physics, Mathematics and Chemistry taken together;
- (d) Higher percentage of marks in the subject Mathematics at HSC;
- (e) Higher percentage of marks in the subject Physics at HSC;
- (f) Higher percentage of marks in Aggregate at HSC.

Q. I am an open category student with PCM less than 45%. Can I opt for engineering with some other subject?

Ans: Instead of Chemistry there are other subjects,

- Physics and Maths (Compulsory) and (Chemistry or Biotechnology or Biology or Technical or Vocational subjects) + CET 2021/ JEE mains 2021

OR

Diploma (45% for Open Category and 40% for reserved Category, 40 % for EWS and PWD)

Also – if you want - You can check your eligibility on the DTE website by entering your marks.

Q. I am from the OBC category but I do not have the related documents. Can I apply for EBC?

Ans: If your admission is through open category by DTE (that means if you have not occupied OBC seat from Govt quota) – you can apply for EBC scholarship provided you have the required Income certificate and all other documents like Domicile, Adhaar card, Bank account on your name etc.

Q. What is the income limit for OBC, NT, VJNT etc?

Ans: The income limit was revised on 01/01/2018 and increased to up to 8 Lakhs with effect from 2017-18 year admissions.

Q. What is the Eligibility Criterion to the persons with disability candidates?

Ans:-

(a) Eligibility criteria for Candidates belonging to Person with Disability:

The candidates should submit a certificate clearly stating that the extent of disability is not less than 40% and the disability is of permanent nature.

Q. I don't have category documents. I got an allotment of open seats. Do I have to pay full fees for the open category for all 4 yrs? How can I keep my category information for future benefits?

Ans: Category once treated open, is applicable for all 4 years. Your basic caste/category if mentioned on the school leaving certificate, college will also mention it on TC for future benefits.

Q. I am a non-Maharashtrian reserved category candidate who has appeared for CET. Shall I get fee benefits applicable for my caste?

Ans: The fee benefits are only for Maharashtra candidates. You will be treated as an open category candidate + OMS (Other than Maharashtra state). Hence you will have to pay full fee. However, you are entitled for category benefits in your home state.

Q. When the education loan is sanctioned by the Bank, will I get it or will the Bank send it to the college directly?

Ans: You have to take admission first by paying necessary fees and apply for a Fee Structure & Bonafide certificate from college. The college will then give the certificate within a week. The bank sanctions the loan after the Bonafide certificate is submitted and sends it to the college or student's account as per bank's policy.

Q. What is TFWS (Tuition fee waiver scheme)? Can we opt for it?

Ans: This scheme has been implemented by the Govt of Maharashtra. Income certificate stating the Income Limit from all sources to be below 8 lakhs is required.

Q. What is the difference between BE & B.Tech.?

Ans: Practically nothing. BE is bachelor of engineering & B.Tech. is bachelor of technology. In Maharashtra most of the universities have named the engineering course as B.E. while IITs and few Autonomous institutes like COE, Pune named it B.Tech.

Q. Is it necessary to give CET for taking admission in the First Year at engineering colleges in Maharashtra?

Ans: Yes. It is necessary to give CET (or JEE or both) for taking admission in first year at all engineering colleges approved by All India Council for Technical Education i.e. AICTE for the academic year 2021 - 22.

Q. Can a student take admission to college in Pune from outside the Pune University area?

Ans: Yes. For getting admission to colleges affiliated to Savitribai Phule Pune University, the student has to apply under the 30% quota of CAP seats earmarked for students from other universities. (As per DTE 2020-21 handbook)

For admission to autonomous colleges, students from other universities can compete for 100% seats.

University Grants Commission (UGC) has conferred *Autonomous Status to Marathwada Mitra Mandal's College of Engineering*, Karvenagar, Pune, **affiliated to Savitribai Phule Pune University from the academic Year 2024-25. Hence the candidates seeking admission to the first year of Engineering, from the jurisdiction of universities other than SPPU can compete for 100 % seats.**

Q. What is important, Branch or College?

Ans: If you are clear about branch selection then college selection becomes secondary but if you are not sure about which branch to select or confused between 2 or 3 branches or ready to take up any branch then do give preference to good college. In connection to your above question, I would like to tell you that MMCOE has been awarded as '*Best Engineering College*' by SPPU and Accredited by NAAC with 'A++' Grade. Also, our two branches i.e. Electrical & Mechanical Engineering are re-accredited by NBA and 3 branches i.e. Information Technology, Computer, Electronics and Telecommunication Engineering have completed the process of assessment recently. MMCOE has a Center *for Invention, Innovation and Incubation* for developing research culture among students. To read more about *TTL-STP-FMCIII*, kindly refer to our website. In addition, MMCOE has good infrastructure, excellent faculty members, various student chapters, well-equipped labs. Also, MMCOE is centrally located. Hostel facilities are available both for boys and girls on campus for outstation students etc.

Q. How to claim seats under management quota at MMCOE?

Ans: You can approach our admission counseling cell on all working days.

Q. Can one apply with a CET score as well as JEE score at the same time?

Ans: Yes. JEE students can apply for 15% quota while CET students can apply for 65% seats. If you have given MHT-CET as well as JEE you can apply for both the quota seats in a single option form. You are allotted -the best of both the allotments- at the end of a particular CAP round.

CATEGORY NO. 2

(Admission enquiries for admission at MMCOE)

Q. What are the working hours for college?

Ans: College works on all days – if required we call students on Sundays for extra lectures. We have a very BUSY schedule throughout the term. We prefer to work even on holidays in order to complete the academic activities or to complete the syllabus. We conduct remedial coaching classes also for weak students.

We have a well defined academic policy to run MMCOE academics. To complete the big task of academics along with various curricular and extracurricular activities, time is not the limit for us.

But we are after the students all the time asking them to complete assignments, homework, practical, tutorial, theory and so forth.

Speaking officially, it is 6 days a week. Morning 8 to 3 pm / 10 to 5 pm (Minimum 7 hrs) and more depending on the need of extra lectures.

Q. Are all these seats open or is there a reservation of any kind?

Ans: Yes, there is reservation according to the Govt. norms declared from time to time.

CATEGORY NO. 3 **(Training placement related FAQ)**

Q. What is the placement percentage?

Ans: Against the eligible students (throughout 60%) around 80% (2019-20) students got the placement. There are few companies which recruit students without any criteria.

Q. Which are the companies that come here for campus recruitment?

Ans: Famous companies like Persistent, Tech Mahindra, Zensar, Syntel, Exusia, Volkswagen, Mahindra & Mahindra, Kirloskar Oil Engine Ltd, Bridgestone Tyres, Keyence India, Imagination Technologies, Directi, Bitwise, Prototech, Amuratech, Xoriant, Webonise lab, Amazon.in, Fiserv, Harbinger, Sanmar Group, Must Garments, Virtusa Polaris, Ellicium Solutions, Raja Software, Eaternus, Financial, Software & Systems, Wisdmlabs, NTT Data, Angular Minds, Axis Technical, Rivigo, Smartalyse, Newgen, VMware, BYJU, Maple, TPT ION, ThyssenKrupp and many more MNCs have campus recruitment to MMCOE and there is an addition every year.

In addition to this overseas placements include: Diva corp, Mitsubishi Electric and YKK Japan.

Q. When does the training for placement start?

Ans: We focus on T&P right from first year (Second Sem).

We have a well developed Corporate Relations Division (CRD) and we maintain a Placement Gradation System for all our students.

CATEGORY NO 4 **(Finance related FAQs - College Fees and Hostel Fees Loan facilities for students)**

Q. What are the fees per year?

Ans: Please refer to Fee structure on the college website.

Q. What is the income limit for EBC scholarship? Who can avail it?

Ans: Upto 8 lakh and is available to only open category students. This Facility is not for institute level admissions.

Q. Is it possible that if the fees are paid per year but my ward comes here for the exam due to some other commitments, is that allowed?

Ans: Please note that this is a full time course. You are taking admission for a full time course where attendance norms are minimum 75% as per University norms and for MMCOE we follow norms of min 90% attendance for theory and 100 % for practical.

CATEGORY NO. 5 (Hostel Enquiries)

Q. How many students per each room in the hostel?

ANS: For Boys: 4 students in one room (Old Building) and 3, 5, 6 students in one room (New Building).
For Girls: 4 students in one room

Q. What is the size of a hostel room?

Ans: There are various sizes of hostel rooms with around 204 sq ft area.
Intake Boys – 240, Girls – 197.

Hostel Common Facilities are as follows:

- Each Student will be provided with one cot, cupboard, book shelf, table, chair, mattress, pillow and bed sheet in the hostel room
- Hostel rooms with attached bathroom
- Wi-Fi enabled Hostel Campus
- Aqua guard filtered drinking water with cooler
- Hot water facility through Solar system/Geyser and provided only during 7.00am to 8.30am
- Sports facilities: Carrom, Chess, Cricket, Football, Volleyball etc
- Newspapers and Magazines
- Television with Dish TV
- Elevators
- Gymnasium
- Two wheeler parking facility

Visit our hostel and have a look at the rooms to get an idea. The hostel is in the campus, near to college so that the students feel secure under the care of experienced Rector

Q. Hostel fees per year? Is Mess optional or compulsory?

ANS. It is Rs. 82000 per year for 2020-21. The fee included breakfast, evening snacks, lunch and dinner (During vacations the mess facility will remain closed). It may increase marginally this year.
